Committee Purpose

Provide guidance to the design team to ensure the new bridge reflects the natural beauty of the Columbia River Gorge and expresses the region's unique cultural identity.

Timeline & Deliverable

The BAC will meet four times between January and June and gather two rounds of public feedback. The committee will use that feedback when making its recommendations, which it will compile into an **Aesthetics Guidance Memorandum.** The bridge designers will consult this document when they choose how the bridge will look — both when traveling across it and when viewing it from a distance.

Meetings & Members

The committee has six community members (three from Oregon and three from Washington) and 16 representatives from agencies and organizations with expertise in transportation or a connection to the Columbia Gorge Scenic Area.
